**VOTER INFORMATION FOR NOVEMBER 6 ELECTION
NEW BY-DISTRICT VOTING IN CHINO HILLS
VOTER REGISTRATION INFORMATION
DROP VOTE-BY-MAIL BALLOTS AT CHINO HILLS CITY HALL**

Chino Hills, CA – The San Bernardino County Registrar of Voters will be mailing voter information pamphlets, and vote-by-mail ballots to voters' mailboxes in early October. To participate in the elections, citizens must register to vote. Voter registration forms are available on the second floor in the City Clerk's Office at Chino Hills City Hall, 14000 City Center Drive. Online registration is available at <https://registertovote.ca.gov>. Registrations must be postmarked or submitted electronically no later than Monday, October 22. The State of California has provided a new safety net for Californians who miss the deadline. Eligible citizens can go to their local elections office (San Bernardino County Registrar of Voters) to register and vote conditionally through Election Day, November 6.

The November 6 election marks the first time Chino Hills City Council Members will be elected based upon the district in which they live, selected by the voters within that same district. Elections will be conducted in Districts 1, 2, and 4. To find your district and learn more, visit www.chinohills.org/Election or call the City Clerk's Office at (909) 364-2624.

The City Clerk's Office at Chino Hills City Hall is an official drop-off location for vote-by-mail ballots. Voters may deposit their ballots, during regular business hours, in a secure election box on the second floor at City Hall, 14000 City Center Drive. Regular business hours are Monday through Thursday from 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., and Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The City Clerk's Office will be open on Election Day, Tuesday, November 6, from 7:30 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. to accept vote-by-mail ballots. Polling place information and official election results are available at the San Bernardino County Registrar of Voters website www.sbcountyelections.com. Polling places are open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.
