EXCHANGE OLD HOLIDAY LIGHTS FOR NEW LED LIGHTS AT CITY OF CHINO HILLS TREE LIGHTING DECEMBER 1

Chino Hills, CA – Celebrate the holiday season with residents of Chino Hills at the City’s annual Tree Lighting Ceremony on Saturday, December 1 from 5:00 –8:00 p.m. at the Chino Hills Government Center, 14000 City Center Drive. For the first time, the City’s tree will be located outdoors in the breezeway between City Hall and the Library. The Tree Lighting Ceremony will start at 6:15 p.m. with the presentation of the colors by Boy Scout Troop 220 and Cub Scout Pack 220. It will begin snowing after the tree lighting and Santa will arrive. Kids who visit with Santa are asked to bring a \$10 unwrapped gift to support the Chino Hills Police Department’s third annual Toy Drive. All gift donations are welcome! The Toy Drive will benefit families in Chino Hills.

The San Bernardino Regional Energy Partnership is offering Chino Hills residents the opportunity to bring two inefficient, incandescent holiday light strands to the event to exchange for two LED holiday light strands. The old light strands must be 50-count or higher, still work, and contain all bulb parts. Residents must provide a copy of their Chino Hills Southern California Edison bill and a photo identification that matches the customer name on the bill. Southern California Gas is offering a free energy efficiency starter kit to residents who bring their SoCal Gas bill and photo identification matching the customer name on the bill.
