**VOTER INFORMATION FOR NOVEMBER 3 ELECTION
NEW BY-DISTRICT VOTING IN CHINO HILLS
VOTER REGISTRATION INFORMATION
DROP VOTE-BY-MAIL BALLOTS AT CHINO HILLS CITY HALL**

Chino Hills, CA – The San Bernardino County Registrar of Voters will be mailing voter information pamphlets, and vote-by-mail ballots to voters' mailboxes in early October. To participate in the elections, citizens must register to vote. Voter registration forms are available on the second floor in the City Clerk's Office at Chino Hills City Hall, 14000 City Center Drive. Online registration is available at <https://registertovote.ca.gov>. Registration must be postmarked or submitted electronically no later than Monday, October 19. The State of California has provided a new safety net for Californians who miss the deadline. Eligible citizens can go to their local elections office (San Bernardino County Registrar of Voters) to register and vote conditionally through Election Day, November 3.

The November 3 election marks the second time Chino Hills City Council Members will be elected based upon the district in which they live, selected by the voters within that same district. Elections will be conducted in Districts 3 and 5. The City of Chino Hills City Hall is an official drop-off location for vote-by-mail ballots. Voters may deposit their ballots 24/7 in a secure ballot drop-off box located in front of the James S. Thalman Chino Hills Library at 14020 City Center Drive, beginning October 6, 2020 through November 3, 2020 at 8:00 p.m. The City Clerk's Office is also hosting a Vote-By-Mail ballot drop-off event on October 22, 2020 from 3:00 to 8:00 p.m. Polling place information and official election results are available at the San Bernardino County Registrar of Voters website www.sbcountyelections.com. Polling places are open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.
