## **CITY OF CHINO HILLS TO HOST VACCINATION EVENT AT MCCOY EQUESTRIAN & RECREATION CENTER – APRIL 6**

Chino Hills, CA – The City of Chino Hills has partnered with San Bernardino County to support essential COVID-19 vaccination efforts and host a vaccination event for residents on Tuesday, April 6 from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm at the McCoy Equestrian and Recreation Center, 14280 Peyton Drive.

“We appreciate the opportunity to partner with San Bernardino County to make the vaccine accessible to residents who are eligible and wish to receive it,” said Mayor Brian Johsz. “Bringing the vaccine to our community is critical in our County’s combined efforts to stop the spread of COVID-19 and encourage a healthy community as we continue to see more of our local businesses reopen.”

All San Bernardino County residents age 50 and over are eligible to receive the vaccine. People age 16-50 with significant underlying medical conditions or disabilities that put them at high risk for serious consequences from COVID-19 are also eligible. Anyone who accompanies an eligible family member to an appointment is also eligible, regardless of age. Appointments are now open and vaccines are administered at no cost.
