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**COVID-19 UPDATE:
CITY OF CHINO HILLS FACILITIES REOPEN EFFECTIVE JUNE 1;
STREET SWEEPING PARKING ENFORCEMENT RESUMES JULY 5**

Chino Hills, CA – The City of Chino Hills will reopen all facilities including the Chino Hills Community Center, McCoy Equestrian & Recreation Center, Sleepy Hollow Community Center, Mystic Canyon Building, and Grand Avenue Park Community Building beginning Tuesday, June 1. The City will also begin accepting gazebo and outdoor facility rental applications for the Chino Hills Community Center and the McCoy Equestrian & Recreation Center on Tuesday, June 1.

Gazebo reservations must be completed in-person and will be processed on a first-come first-serve basis at the Government Center Recreation Office located at 14000 City Center Drive. Facility rental applications must also be completed in-person and will be processed at the Chino Hills Community Center located at 14250 Peyton Drive. Reservations and rentals must comply with the current health guidelines in place at the time of booking and the State of California and San Bernardino County Private Event Guidance. Street sweeping parking enforcement will resume on public streets throughout Chino Hills beginning Monday, July 5. Public residential streets are swept twice per month to keep the City's streets clean and storm drains clear of debris. Vehicles are not permitted to park on the street during a designated street sweeping day between the hours of 8:00 am to 4:00 pm. Residents can view the street sweeping schedule and check their street sweeping days by entering their address online through the City's GIS Interactive Map at www.chinohills.org/StreetSweeping. Signs including designated street sweeping days are also posted at the entrance to each neighborhood, so residents are aware of their street sweeping day.

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Residents are allowed up to three street sweeping waiver requests per year in the event they are unable to move their car prior to their street sweeping day. Waivers must be requested at least 24 hours in advance, prior to sweeping and issuance of a citation. Waivers can be requested by phone by calling the Public Works Department at (909) 364-2800.

In anticipation of the State of California’s plan to reopen California on Tuesday, June 15, the City anticipates reopening Council Chambers to the public for in-person attendance beginning with the Tuesday, June 22 City Council meeting. Commission meetings will reopen to the public for in-person attendance beginning in July. Staff continues to provide City services via telephone, online, and in some cases by appointment. Facility openings are subject to change and will be modified in accordance with health guidelines from the State of California and County of San Bernardino.
