COVID-19 UPDATE: STREET SWEEPING PARKING ENFORCEMENT TO RESUME ON JULY 6

Chino Hills, CA – The City of Chino Hills will resume street sweeping parking enforcement on public streets throughout Chino Hills and begin issuing \$43 street sweeping citations on Tuesday, July 6, 2021. Public residential streets are swept twice per month to keep the City's streets clean and storm drains clear of debris. The City stopped issuing street sweeping parking citations in mid-March 2020 when Governor Newsom issued Stay-at-Home orders, requiring many residents to remain at home.

Residents can view the street sweeping schedule and check their street sweeping days by entering their address online through the City's GIS Interactive Map at www.chinohills.org/StreetSweeping or by calling the Public Works Department at (909) 364-2800. Signs including designated street sweeping days are also posted at the entrance to each neighborhood, so residents are aware of their street sweeping day. The website also has a list of City-recognized holidays when citations are not issued. Vehicles are not permitted to park on the street during a designated street sweeping day between the hours of 8:00 am to 4:00 pm. The City does not provide street sweeping on private streets.

The City has a courtesy program to allow residents up to three street sweeping waiver requests per year under certain circumstances. Waivers must be requested at least one business day in advance, prior to sweeping and issuance of a citation. Waivers can be requested by phone by calling the Public Works Department at (909) 364-2800. If a resident has contractors working at the house, they may request a waiver. If permits are required for the work being done, City staff will verify that permits have been pulled for the work before allowing a waiver. Waivers are not granted simply to accommodate households that have more cars than can fit in the driveway at a residence. Recreational vehicles (RV) may qualify for an exemption, but they must have first obtained the free Temporary Parking Permit that is required to park an RV on the street at any time.
