CHINO HILLS MAYOR RAY MARQUEZ ELECTED TO REPRESENT CHINO HILLS IN AN AT-LARGE POSITION ON LEAGUE OF CALIFORNIA CITIES BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Chino Hills, CA – Chino Hills Mayor Ray Marquez was elected to serve as one of six at-large directors on the League of California Cities (Cal Cities) Board of Directors. The announcement was made during the Cal Cities Annual Conference and Expo on Friday, September 9. Mayor Marquez was elected to one of only six at-large positions out of 482 cities in California and will represent Chino Hills in a two-year term.

“Cal Cities is an important organization that advocates and helps to protect our local City control and it is essential Chino Hills has representation and a voice in this organization,” said Mayor Ray Marquez. “I am proud to represent my community and I look forward to continuing to build strong relationships on behalf of our City with neighboring Cities and our elected officials across the State during my time as Director.”

Established in 1898, the League of California Cities, later renamed Cal Cities, is a nonprofit statewide association that advocates for cities with the state and federal governments and provides education and training services to elected and appointed city officials. Cal Cities’ mission is to expand and protect local control for cities through education and advocacy to enhance the quality of life for all Californians.

All five Chino Hills City Council Members including Mayor Ray Marquez, Vice Mayor Rogers, and Council Members Art Bennett, Brian Johsz, and Cynthia Moran are active members of Cal Cities. In addition to serving as an at-large Director, Mayor Marquez also serves as president of the Cal Cities Inland Empire Division Executive Committee, and as a member of the Cal Cities Latino Caucus Board of Directors, Latino Caucus Legislative Committee, Vice Chair of the Public Safety Policy Committee and on the State-level Legislative Task Force. Council Member Brian Johsz serves alongside Mayor Marquez on the State-level Legislative Task Force. Council Member Moran furthers Chino Hills’ representation by serving on the Cal Cities Environmental Quality Policy Committee and as part of the Women’s Caucus.
