## **2023 CITY FACILITY AND CITY SERVICES HOLIDAY SCHEDULE**

Chino Hills, CA – All City facilities will be closed on Monday, December 25 and Monday, January 1. The Chino Hills City Hall and City Yard will be closed for the holidays from Monday, December 25 through Tuesday, January 2. The James S. Thalman Library and Chino Hills Police Department lobby will be closed Sunday, December 24 through Tuesday, December 26 and Monday, January 1 through Tuesday, January 2.

On-site offices for Community Park and Grand Avenue Park will be closed Sunday, December 24 and Monday, December 25, and on Sunday, December 31 and Monday, January 1. Parking lot gates for Grand Avenue Park will remain open for access to the field and playground areas and will close at 7:00 pm. Parking lot gates for Community Park will remain open for trail access to the Eucalyptus and McCoy Loop and will close at 7:00 pm. Gates to the fields and playground area will remain closed.

To accommodate extra visitors in neighborhoods throughout Chino Hills during the holiday season, the City has declared a citation-free period for street sweeping parking violations. The City will not issue street sweeping parking citations during the holiday period from Friday, December 22 through Tuesday, January 2. Street sweeping enforcement will resume on Wednesday, January 3. Other types of parking citations may be issued during this time, as the citation-free period only applies to street sweeping.

Trash and recycling collection by delayed by one day for regular collection days that fall on or after Christmas and New Year's Day. Live holiday trees may be put out for recycling at the curb or next to a residential dumpster on regularly scheduled trash pick-up days from Tuesday, December 26 through Friday, January 12. All decorations, tinsel, and the tree stand must be removed. Trees over six feet tall must be cut in half. Flocked trees cannot be recycled and must be chopped up and placed in the trash cart (black lid).

City staff is available "on-call" to respond to emergencies, such as water leaks or downed trees, after hours, and on holidays and weekends by calling (909) 364-2860.
