

# City Hall Recovery Continues After June Fire and Water Damage

### **Temporary Customer Service Center Open at City Hall**



Chino Hills City Hall is undergoing a major remediation and recovery effort following a June fire that caused significant water damage. While full restoration is expected to take several months, the City is committed to delivering essential services to our community without interruption

and is offering in-person services through a temporary Customer Service Center located in the main lobby and Council Chambers. This setup ensures continued service to the public in a safe and efficient manner.

Immediately following the incident, City Hall staff quickly mobilized to pack and clear the building to protect critical records, equipment, and materials. This effort made way for the first phase of restoration, which is now underway. The City's contractor is actively working to replace damaged drywall, flooring, and ceiling panels, and make any necessary electrical and other repairs.

In the meantime, City staff are available at the City Hall Customer Service Center to assist with utility billing, code enforcement, building and planning services, engineering, and passport appointments. Residents are encouraged to visit the City's website to access services online and schedule appointments as needed. Please note that in-person payments can be made by card, check, or money order. Cash is not currently accepted.

# Stay Ready, Stay Connected

Taking important steps now can help you protect your home and family during an emergency. Home hardening activities such as clearing leaves and debris from your roof and gutters, trimming plants away from your home, and using ember-resistant vents can help reduce fire risk and improve your property's resilience. Creating defensible space with well-maintained, fire-resistant landscaping and non-combustible zones around your home can go a long way in protecting your property and enhancing neighborhood-wide safety. If an evacuation becomes necessary, leaving early gives you and your loved ones more time to exit and helps first responders focus on their fire-fighting efforts.

Staying connected and informed is key to preparedness! Consider setting up your phone as a Wi-Fi hotspot or investing in a mobile broadband device to maintain internet access during service interruptions. Portable power stations, mobile chargers, car chargers, and solar-powered options can keep your devices running if the power goes out. Identify local facilities with public Wi-Fi and keep a written list of key phone numbers and websites in case your digital access is unavailable. Signing up for emergency alerts and following official city, police, fire, and utility social media accounts are great ways to stay informed.



# **New Fire Hazard Severity Zone Map** Takes Effect September 1

#### From The Chino Valley Fire District



Wildfires are a fact of life in California and the beautiful City of Chino Hills is not immune to this. The City of Chino Hills is a part of a wildland urban interface, which means it is imperative that you have your wildfire preparedness plan. Earlier this year, CAL FIRE released updated fire hazard severity zones (FHSZ) for the entire state. As the agency responsible for fire protection for Chino Hills, Chino Valley Fire District (CVFD) served as the local agency responsible for the adoption of the updated maps. To view the maps and a timeline related to their adoption, please visit chinovalleyfire.org/fire-hazard-severity-zone-map.

Living in a designated fire hazard zone and or a wildland urban interface requires action. During a wildfire, flying embers, direct flame contact and radiant heat can threaten your home. By taking the necessary steps to create and maintain defensible space and by hardening your home, you can help increase your



homes' survival. "Ready, Set, Go" is a wildfire preparedness plan that outlines various steps you can take to help protect you, your family, and your property. To download the Ready, Set, Go brochure, use the QR code.

#### How do I find out what zone my property is located in?

Visit the Chino Valley Fire District website above and follow the link to the Fire Hazard Severity Zone. Once the map is open, select the magnifying glass in the upper lefthand corner and enter your address.

#### What does it mean if my property is in the very high (red) zone?

If your property is in the newly adopted very high FHSZ, you are legally required by Government Code and CVFD Ordinance 2022-01 to comply with defensible space requirements. In addition, upon sale of the property you are required to comply with the hazard disclosure requirements. For any new construction or additions, it would be required to comply with building standards for the wildland urban interface. You are highly encouraged to create a wildfire preparedness plan for you, your family, and your property.

#### What does it mean if my property is in the high (orange) zone?

If your property is in the newly adopted high FHSZ, you are legally required by the CVFD Ordinance 2022-01 to comply with defensible space requirements. In addition, upon sale of the property you are required to comply with the hazard disclosure requirements. For any new construction or additions, it would be required to comply with building standards for the wildland urban interface. You are highly encouraged to review and create a wildfire preparedness plan for you, your family and your property.

#### What does it mean if my property is in the moderate (yellow) zone?

### CITY ADOPTS BUDGET WITH \$2.2M DEFICIT

#### **Preserving Essential Services and Maintaining High Quality of Life will Require Use of Reserves**

The City of Chino Hills adopted its Fiscal Year (FY) 2025–26 budget at the June 10 City Council Meeting, which includes a \$2.2 million General Fund deficit. This year's budget will require the use of General Fund Reserves (the City's savings account) to maintain essential services and preserve the quality of life Chino Hills residents expect. Before drawing on reserves, the City has taken many steps over the last few years to proactively reduce costs wherever possible and maximize available resources. While the City remains financially stable overall, this deficit signifies a need for strategic long-term revenue planning.

#### **City Budget in Brief**

#### For FY 2025-26, the City's total budget across all funds is:

- Total Revenues (All Funds): \$147.9 million
- Total Expenditures (All Funds): \$150 million

#### Within all funds, the General Fund budget is:

• Revenues: \$56.4 million

Expenditures: \$58.6 million

This means the City's expenses are projected to be \$2.2 million more than what the City will bring in through revenue sources. The projected \$2.2 million deficit will be covered using General Fund Reserves, or the City's "savings account."


The contract with the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department for police services makes up 32 percent of the City's General Fund expenses.


### The Importance of the City's General Fund

While most of the City's revenue is restricted and must be spent for specific purposes such as water, sewer, and landscaping, the General Fund is the City's most flexible funding source. It supports many of the daily services and operations residents rely on that help contribute to the City's high quality of life including police services, street maintenance, infrastructure repairs, recreation programs, and special events.

Reserves are like the City's savings account, with money set

aside over time as a safety net for emergencies and unexpected or long-term needs. As many residents know, through business or personal experience, using reserves or savings to fund ongoing operating expenditures long-term is not sustainable.





#### **General Fund Reserve Breakdown:**

- Current Total Reserves: \$46.9 million
- Projected Reserves In 5 Years: \$27.1 million
- Unrestricted Reserves Within Total Reserves (Rainy-Day Fund/Savings Account): \$34.9 million

#### What's Driving the Deficit?

This year's deficit is not a result of overspending, it reflects the realities that revenue growth has not kept pace with the needs of a maturing City and growing infrastructure demands. The City's roads, parks, and infrastructure are all aging, and the cost to maintain, and in some cases replace, have outpaced revenue growth.

Key factors include:

- Inflation: Higher costs for materials, contracts, and utilities.
- Declining Sales Tax Revenues: Reduced consumer spending by residents and visitors and lower fuel prices.
- Aging Infrastructure: Roads, parks, and public facilities are all aging and need more repairs and upgrades.
- Wildfire Prevention: Increased investment in weed abatement and fire safety to protect our community and vulnerable hillsides.
- Landscape Maintenance Costs: Costs for maintaining landscaping, parks, trees, and open space continue to grow, especially in areas with deferred maintenance.
- Water and Utility Costs: Increased utility rates for electricity, gas, and the rising cost of irrigation for parks and medians.
- Landscape & Lighting (L&L) District Support:
   This year, the City must cover a \$3.8 million shortfall to sustain neighborhood maintenance. When Proposition 218 passed in November 1996, it took away the authority of local jurisdictions to adjust assessments for L&L funding to keep up with inflation without voter approval.



### What Has the City Done to Manage and Cut Costs?

Before drawing on reserves, the City has taken many proactive steps to be more efficient and made careful, deliberate financial decisions to build healthy reserves and stretch every dollar.

This includes:

- Deferring non-essential maintenance and capital improvement projects.
- Securing millions in grant funding to offset costs for public safety, infrastructure, and community enhancement projects.
- Making long-term efficiency investments, which in turn reduce future expenses, such as expanding the recycled water system, installing drought-tolerant landscaping, and installing water systems to reduce reliance on costly imported water.

#### **Looking Ahead**

Chino Hills has long been recognized for its conservative financial management, balanced budgets, and commitment to delivering high-quality public services while maintaining strong reserves. As our City grows and our infrastructure ages, so do the financial challenges we face.

While the FY 2025-26 budget will rely on reserves, relying on them to fund an ongoing budget deficit is not a feasible or sustainable approach to maintaining a healthy City organization.

The City remains committed to maintaining the high quality of life for residents, delivering essential services, and protecting reserves for long-term needs and emergencies. As we move forward, there is a clear need to explore options for new, locally controlled sources of revenue and the City will continue to communicate transparently with our residents about the City's budget challenges.

### **NEW WASTE MANAGEMENT FEES IN EFFECT**

#### Overage and Contamination Charges Will Now Appear on WM Bills

As of July 1, 2025, Waste Management (WM) has begun charging fees for recycling and organic cart contamination and overfilling in Chino Hills. The contamination changes are part of California's SB 1383 regulations which must be implemented by all cities, and aims to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by improving the way cities collect and process recycling and organic waste.

#### Here's What You Need to Know

Since January 2024, WM has been monitoring carts using Smart Truck® Technology, which takes photos of recycling and organics carts to identify contamination and overfilled carts. Residents have received educational notices from WM when issues were found, but charges have not been applied.

To comply with State law and ensure clean waste streams, fees are now being assessed after multiple repeat offenses. To help residents adjust, notices received before July 1, 2025, do not count toward future enforcement. Only incidents on or after July 1 are included in enforcement.

#### What is Contamination and Overfilling?

**Contamination** occurs when items are placed in the wrong cart, such as plastic bags or food-soiled paper in the recycling cart, and plastic or compostable bags in the organics cart.

**Overfilling** occurs when the lid cannot close completely due to excess materials or items that are too large.

#### **How the Enforcement Process Works**

WM is implementing the enforcement process below to help educate residents and impose charges starting from six (6) months from the date of the first incident:

#### First and Second Incidents:

- Carts are serviced.
- A notification letter (or emails, if preferred) is sent with photo evidence.
- No fees are charged.

#### Subsequent Incidents (Third incident and beyond within six months):

- · Carts are serviced.
- A notification letter (or emails, if preferred) is sent with photo evidence.
- Fees are assessed:
  - o Contamination Fee: \$28.08 per incident
  - o Overage Fee: \$16.85 per incident

Proper sorting of waste and keeping lids closed ensures that recycling and organic materials can be successfully processed or composted. Thank you for your cooperation as we work to keep the streets clean and collection routes safe!

### **E-Bike and Motorized Scooter Safety**

As students and families gear up for a new school year, now is the perfect time to brush up on safety tips and local regulations. In January 2025, a new City ordinance took effect that prohibits riding electric bikes (e-bike) and motorized scooters on sidewalks, trails, and in City-owned parks and open spaces. This includes areas near schools and the Chino Hills Government Center.

To stay safe and avoid fines, please remember:

- Use caution when riding in bike lanes or streets, obey all traffic laws, and do not swerve between lanes or vehicles.
- Yield to pedestrians, especially near schools and crosswalks.
- Inspect your brakes, tire pressure, and battery charge before use.
- Wear a helmet (required for riders under 18).

#### **New Mobile Recreation Vehicle**



#### **SaveStation at Community Park**

The City's second SaveStation was installed at Community Park near fields five and six to improve access to lifesaving emergency equipment. SaveStations house automated external defibrillators (AEDs) and are accessible 24/7. This station supplements the existing AED machine already located in the staff office. Like the first tower that was installed at Grand Avenue Park, this second SaveStation was donated by the Chino Valley Fire Foundation and the Chino Hills Community Foundation.





# 1,2,3-TCP Water Treatment Facility on Eucalyptus Avenue Nears Completion

The City of Chino Hills is nearing completion of the new 1,2,3-TCP Water Treatment Facility! The project was developed in response to the State Water Resources Control Board lowering the maximum level of 1,2,3-Trichloropropane (1,2,3-TCP) found in groundwater for all cities throughout California.

Construction reached substantial completion in June 2025 and is expected to be operational by December 2025. The delay is due to the state requiring an additional metering station to be constructed for blending water in the distribution system with well water. 



All park facilities open 30 minutes before sunrise and close 30 minutes after sunset unless otherwise noted. No private lessons are allowed. For more information visit chinohills.org/MunicipalCode. #### **Baseball and Soccer Fields**

Baseball and soccer fields at City parks are available by permitted use only. For more information regarding field allocations, contact Community Park at (909) 597-4443.

#### **Basketball Courts**

There are 18 parks throughout the City with half or full basketball courts. All courts operate on a first-come, first-served basis during park hours. Grand Avenue Park offers three full courts with lights from 8:00 a.m. – 9:45 p.m. Some facility availability may change due to City programming.

#### Skate Park

The City offers a free skate park for skaters of all ages to pop ollies, grind rails, and practice kick-flips. The park is not staffed and users skate at their own risk. Protective gear is required.

Daily: 7:00 a.m. - Dusk

#### Pickleball

Vellano Park offers four lighted pickleball courts. Lights turn off at 10:00 p.m. Grand Avenue Park also offers four temporary courts on the Roller Hockey Rink. Courts are available on a first-come, first-served basis. For more information about the Grand Avenue Park pickleball schedule, visit chinohills.org/Pickleball.

#### **Roller Hockey Rink**

The City offers one (1) regulation-sized roller hockey rink with lights for people to enjoy. This rink is available for drop-in use as well as private rentals. Rink availability may change due to City programming or rental schedule. For more information, visit chinohills.org/RollerHockey.

#### Sand Volleyball Courts

Sand volleyball courts are available for park patrons on a first-come, first-served basis at Calle San Marcos Park, English Springs Park, and Skyview Park.

#### **Tennis Courts**

There are a total of eight (8) tennis courts available at three (3) different City parks. City courts operate on a first-come, first-served basis. Availability may change due to City programs and classes.

#### **FACILITIES**

#### Dog Park

Vila Borba Dog Park offers separate enclosed areas for large and small dogs to run freely. Please read the rules posted at the entrance prior to entry or online at **chinohills.org/DogPark**. The Dog Park is closed every Tuesday from 6:00 - 11:00 a.m. for regular maintenance.

#### Gazebos

The City manages the use of 14 rentable gazebos which may be reserved for birthday parties, family gatherings, picnics, or other similar events for groups up to 50 people. Gazebo reservations are not intended to be used for fundraisers, special events, commercial uses (where a fee is charged or money is collected), activities that are "open to the public," or events/ gatherings over 50 people. Reservation schedules are posted on the outside of the gazebo. If no reservation is scheduled the gazebos are available on a first-come, firstserved basis. Reservations must be made in person at the Community Center or the Recreation Office at City Hall. For a full listing, visit chinohills.org/Gazebos.

#### **Special Event Permits**

Temporary use of property for special events including large events, religious events, school activities, etc. require a special event permit. Permit information can be found at chinohills.org/CHPermits.

#### **Trails**

Residents value the rural atmosphere that has been preserved in Chino Hills. The City has over 3,000 acres of open space and 48 miles of trails available for use and enjoyment. There are 16 trailheads that lead to 28 trails throughout Chino Hills. 
