Holiday Hours for Recreation Facilities

All City recreation facilities including Community Center, Grand Avenue Park, Community Park, and the McCoy Equestrian & Recreation Center will be closed on November 27 and 28, December 24, 25, 31, and January 1. On all other days, the City's recreation facilities are open during normal business hours.

On the above closure dates, amenities at Grand Avenue Park and Community Park amenities will remain open until 7:00 pm, except on November 27 and December 25, when all gate-accessed fields and courts will be completely closed. For further questions about field closures please contact Grand Avenue Park at (909) 548-4942.

Street Sweeping Parking Holiday Enforcement

To accommodate extra visitors during the holiday season, the City has declared a citation-free period for street sweeping parking violations. No street sweeping parking citations will be issued during the Thanksgiving holiday from Wednesday, November 26 through Friday, November 28. Enforcement will resume Monday, December 1.

Enforcement will also be suspended for the Christmas and New Year's holidays from Monday, December 22 through Thursday, January 1. Enforcement will resume on Friday, January 2. Other types of parking tickets may be issued during this time, as the citation-free period only applies to street-sweeping parking tickets. Passport Services Holiday Closures

Passport services will not be available at City Hall from Monday, December 8 through Friday, January 2. If you plan to travel during the holidays and need to apply for a passport, please make an appointment before then.

At other times, passport services are available by appointment only at City Hall. Appointments are available to schedule online on Monday and Wednesdays from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Tuesdays from 9:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Thursdays from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and Fridays from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. Appointment availability may change without notice. 
City Hall Recovery Update

Chino Hills City Hall is on track to fully reopen to the public by December 2025 following extensive restoration work that has taken place since the fire and resulting water damage in June. All City staff have now transitioned from temporary work locations back into City Hall as interior restoration nears completion. The building's interior has been fully cleaned and repaired, and at time of print in October, work is now focused on final workstation installation, public counter restoration, and elevator repairs in preparation for reopening.

Although the fire itself was contained in a small area, the building's fire suppression sprinkler system truly did its job to extinguish the fire quickly, and in turn released thousands of gallons of water, requiring a comprehensive, building-wide restoration effort.

Since June, contractors and City staff have worked to restore City Hall to a safe and functional workspace. Completed work includes:

- Extensive water remediation throughout the facility
- Replacement of drywall, carpeting, ceiling tiles, and workstations in impacted areas
- Electrical and IT repairs and standardization to restore essential infrastructure
- Installation of new furniture, computers, monitors, and other workspace equipment



construction following June fire and water damage.



Serving the Community During the Closure

Throughout the closure, City staff continued to provide uninterrupted services through a temporary Customer Service Center in the Council Chambers, which assisted an average of 53 people per day.

All in-person services were offered through this Center including Utility Billing, Building and Planning, Code Enforcement, Engineering, and Passports. All online services, Recreation programs, fall and summer events, and community activities continued without interruption.

What's Next

With all employees now working from City Hall, the City is preparing for a full reopening and return to normal in-person services planned for December 2025 or before. The City will share additional updates and an exact reopening date at www.chinohills.org as the transition nears.

The City of Chino Hills thanks our residents, businesses, and community partners for their patience and support throughout this recovery process. We also commend our dedicated City employees for their continued commitment to providing high-quality customer service to our residents while navigating challenging circumstances.

Where Do Your Tax Dollars Go?

Understanding How Your Money is Used

As a property owner and resident of Chino Hills, you may wonder where your property and sales tax dollars go and how they are used to fund the services you rely on. The reality is, when you pay taxes, only a small portion stays local to fund City services. Most property and sales tax dollars are not locally controlled, they are distributed to the State, County, schools, or other regional agencies and not directly to the City of Chino Hills.

The City's General Fund relies primarily on property and sales tax revenues to pay for City services that protect the safety of our community, maintain our streets, and support the high quality of life residents value. This includes police services, recreation programs, wildfire preparedness, parks and landscape maintenance, and infrastructure repairs.

Property Tax

Property tax is the largest funding source for the City, but even then, the City receives one of the lowest percentages in San Bernardino County at just 4% of property taxes paid. That means for every \$1 of property tax paid, the City only receives \$0.04 back to fund City services.

For a home assessed at \$500,000 in Chino Hills paying an annual property tax rate of 1%, or \$5,000, only \$200 would come back to the City as local revenue to fund City services.

Property Tax Distribution

This year, Chino Hills residents paid \$493 million in property taxes. Of that, the City received \$19.7 million.

Sales Tax

When residents and visitors shop in Chino Hills, a 7.75% sales tax is paid on most purchases. For every \$1 of sales tax paid, the City only receives one percent of the share while the majority goes to the State and County.

Sales Tax Distribution

For every \$1 spent by residents and visitors in Chino Hills, the 7.75% sales tax paid is distributed to:





This year, Chino Hills residents and visitors generated \$79.8M in sales tax revenue, but the City only receives a small portion of that.

What These Dollars Fund in Chino Hills

Together, property tax and sales tax revenue make up a substantial portion (54%) of the City's General Fund. Even with limited property and sales tax revenue, the City's General Fund supports essential services residents rely on every day, such as:

- Police services and crime prevention
- Wildfire prevention and weed abatement
- Street maintenance and infrastructure repairs
- Tree trimming, landscaping, and open space maintenance
- Parks, recreation programs, and community events



Chino Hills' Financial Outlook

The City currently has a \$2.2 million General Fund annual budget deficit, which is projected to more than double over the next five years. The City's reserves, or the City's savings account and rainy-day fund, are being used to cover the difference. As many residents know through business or household budgets, using reserves or savings to cover ongoing expenses is not sustainable long-term.

The deficit is not the result of overspending, rather it reflects a reality many families and businesses are also facing-revenues are not keeping pace with the growing costs of a thriving community. Future budgets will need to further decrease spending, or increase revenue.

Chino Hills has a long track record of fiscal responsibility, balanced budgets, and high-quality services. The City has already taken significant steps to manage and cut costs, including deferring repairs and maintenance, securing millions in grant funding, maintaining a lean workforce, and making long-term efficiency investments.

Still, without identifying new sources of locally controlled revenue, the City will face difficult choices in the coming years that could force essential City services and programs residents rely on to be reduced or eliminated.

What's Next?

The City is committed to maintaining open and transparent conversations with our residents about the City's finances and budget challenges. Residents are encouraged to stay informed and involved, The City Council will hold a priority-setting session in January 2026 to establish goals for the next two years. New City Website

The City of Chino Hills has unveiled a redesigned website aimed at making it easier and faster for residents to access City services. The updated site features a clean, modern design with simplified navigation, improved search functions, and a mobile-friendly layout. User accessibility has also been enhanced with translation tools for over 60 languages and features like adjustable text size and screen reader support. Holiday Tree Recycling

Residents may recycle their holiday tree by placing it on the ground next to their carts when they are placed at the curb on their regular trash collection day between Friday, December 26 and Thursday, January 15. Holiday trees larger than six feet tall must be cut in half to be eligible for pick up. Alternatively, residents may also chop their tree and place it inside their organics cart (green lid). The lid must close completely with all tree pieces fitting inside. All decorations, tinsel, and the tree stand must be removed. Flocked trees cannot be recycled and must be chopped up and placed inside the trash cart (black lid) or residents may request a bulky item pickup by contacting Waste Management (WM).

New Recycling Education

Bulky Item Pickup for the Holidays

Chino Hills residents may request a bulky item pickup at no cost to handle large trash items generated during the holiday season (depending on the size). WM offers three free bulky item pickups per calendar year for up to ten bulky items including furniture, appliances, and e-waste, or ten bags of yard waste. Additional bulky item pickups are available at a nominal cost. Bulky items that cannot be handled by two persons will not be accepted. Pickups must be requested at least 48-hours in advance of your collection day. Be prepared to list all items when scheduling the pickup. Holiday Waste Guide what goes where?



The holidays are a time for celebration, but they can also lead to a big increase in household waste. From Thanksgiving feasts to leftover gift wrap, many common holiday items end up in the wrong cart. We encourage residents to do their part to keep our waste system running smoothly by following these simple tips for sorting holiday waste!



Can I compost my Thanksgiving leftovers?

Yes! All food waste (cooked or raw) such as uneaten fruits, vegetables, meats, dairy, bones, and baked goods are disposable and should be placed in your GREEN ORGANICS CART.

What kind of gift wrap should I use?

Consider using plain wrapping paper, which can be recycled in your **BLUE RECYCLING CART!** Wrapping paper that is metallic, glossy, or covered in glitter cannot be recycled and needs to be placed in your **BLACK TRASH CART**.





What do I do with fats, oils, and grease?

Never pour fats, oils, or grease (FOG's) down the drain as these items are considered household hazardous waste (HHW)! Instead, pour cooled FOG's into a sealed container and bring it to a HHW collection facility for safe disposal. To learn more and see a list of local locations, visit www.chinohills.org/HHW.

What should I do with used giftboxes or bags?

If you can't reuse gift boxes or bags, break them down and place them in your **BLUE RECYCLING CART**. Flattening cardboard creates more space in your cart and helps prevent overfilling!





Over \$6.8M in Street Improvement Projects Completed in 2024



Residential streets within the Rolling Ridge, Green Valley, Whirlaway, Palisade, and Glen Meade communities were the primary areas included in the City's annual 2024-25 street improvement project. The work included minor and major patch work, seal coat, installation of a protected left turn along Woodbridge Street, improved pedestrian crosswalks, and grind and overlay improvements to 14 lane miles of streets at a cost of \$2.1 million. This work usually starts in May to minimize impacts to the community and as soon as schools are on summer break.

Street improvements were also made along major arterial roads including Soquel Canyon Parkway, Eucalyptus Avenue, Scenic Ridge Drive, Rimrock Avenue and Butterfield Ranch Road which had a total street rehabilitation cost of \$4.7 million. The City aims to accomplish at least \$1 million in road maintenance projects each year to ensure our streets are always well maintained.

Grand Avenue Park LED Lighting Upgrade

The City recently completed a lighting upgrade at Grand Avenue Park, replacing 72 athletic field and court lights with new energy-efficient LED fixtures. The advanced LED system improves visibility and safety for our park users, reduced maintenance needs, and is expected to reduce energy usage by about 60 percent, supporting the City's sustainability goals. The total project cost was \$492,000 and funded by the General Fund and the Community Facilities District 2 Fund.

2025 Emergency Preparedness Workshop Recap



In September, the City hosted a free Emergency Preparedness Workshop that featured presentations from City staff, Chino Valley Fire District, Chino Hills Police Department, major wireless carriers, and other community partners. Over 130 people attended and learned practical steps to prepare for emergencies, including building an emergency kit, creating wildfire defense zones, understanding evacuation procedures, and maintaining communication during outages.

Chino Hills Community Park

Celebrating the \$10.1M Rehabilitation Project
September 6, 2025





Community Park opened in its current location in 2007, after relocating from Grand and Peyton Avenue. Since opening, it has become a hub for youth sports and recreation, serving tens of thousands of residents and visitors annually.

In November 2022, the City launched a multi-phase \$10.1M rehabilitation project to modernize facilities, replace and install new artificial turf on all ball fields, create 84 new parking spaces, and to enhance the experience for all park users. Construction occurred in phases to minimize disruptions to youth sports groups and the project's completion was celebrated in September 2025.





This project was funded by the City of Chino Hills, American Rescue Plan Act, and a special thanks to San Bernardino County Supervisor Curt Hagman for his support of \$250,000!

City Seeks to Return Unclaimed Property

The City of Chino Hills is working to return unclaimed property owed to businesses or individuals who have uncashed checks issued to them by the City within the last three years. To check for unclaimed funds, visit www.chinohills.org/UnclaimedProperty. The list is made available monthly on the City website and includes checks that are stale dated or have been returned to the City as unable to locate.

The City makes every effort to return funds to their rightful owners. Unclaimed property is held by the City for three years and letters are sent to notify individuals or businesses who are owed a refund. The deadline to file a claim for reimbursement of unclaimed property more than three years old is November 26, 2025. Any funds held for more than three years and not claimed by the November 25 deadline will become property of the City in accordance with the State of California Government Code.



GENERAL INFORMATION

The Community Services Department reserves the right to cancel any activity or program due to low enrollment. If the Department cancels a program, all fees will be refunded. Activity, dates, times, fees, and locations are subject to change. Classes will not be prorated for late registration. Missed classes due to participant illness or absence will not be refunded or provided a make-up class.

Please be advised there is a non-refundable convenience fee of 2.5% assessed on all credit/debit card transactions. This fee appears as a separate charge on your bank statement. Returned checks will be charged a \$25 fee. Non-residents will be charged an additional \$5 fee per person, per activity.

REFUND POLICY

For classes with one or two meetings, refund requests will ONLY be honored if they are made at least one (1) day prior to the start of the class. For classes that consist of three (3) or more meetings, the refund request must be submitted before the second class meeting. Adult Sports Leagues, Aquatics, Day Camp, and various special event programs have a separate refund policy, please visit www.chinohills. org/Registration for full policy details.

Refunds must be requested in-person by submitting a Cancellation/
Transfer Form. All refund requests are subject to administrative
approval by the Community Services Department. Please allow up to
six (6) weeks for refunds to be processed. Payments made via credit/
debit card will be refunded back to the original form of payment.
Payments made via cash or check will be refunded by check.

A \$5 per class, per participant processing fee will be deducted from all refund requests, even if the refund remains as a household credit. Refunds of \$100 or less may be retained as household credits to be used towards registration in future Community Services programs. Credits of \$15 or less must be used within one year. Credits of \$16 - \$99 are valid for three years.

The City offers a free skate park for skaters of all ages to pop ollies, grind rails, and practice kick-flips. The park is not staffed and users skate at their own risk. Protective gear is required.

Pickleball

Vellano Park offers four lighted pickleball courts. Lights turn off at 10:00 p.m. Grand Avenue Park also offers four temporary courts on the Roller Hockey Rink. Roller Hockey Rink

Gazebos

The City manages the use of 14 rentable gazebos which may be reserved for birthday parties, family gatherings, picnics, or other similar events for groups up to 50 people. Gazebo reservations are not intended to be used for fundraisers, special events, commercial uses (where a fee is charged or money is collected), activities that are "open to the public," or events/ gatherings over 50 people. Reservation schedules are posted on the outside of the gazebo. If no reservation is scheduled the gazebos are available on a first-come, firstserved basis. Reservations must be made in person at the Community Center or the Recreation Office at City Hall. For a full listing, visit chinohills.org/Gazebos.
