SUPREME COURT DENIES CITY'S PETITION FOR REVIEW

The City of Chino Hills received word from the City Attorney that the Supreme Court denied the City's petition for review of the Court of Appeal's September 12 decision that affirmed the S.B. County Superior Court Judge's ruling that the Superior Court does not have jurisdiction with regard to the complaint the City filed against SCE based on Tehachapi Renewable Transmission Project (TRTP) Segment 8A "overburdening the easement over City property." (Court of Appeal Case #E051033.) The decision was posted following the Supreme Court's scheduled conference on Wednesday, December 21.

"The City is disappointed, but not surprised, that the Supreme Court denied our petition for review of our property rights case relative to the Tehachapi Renewable Transmission Project," said Mayor Art Bennett. "The Supreme Court only accepts a small percentage of the cases submitted."

According to Mayor Bennett, the City will continue efforts to fully participate in the California Public Utilities review of alternate routes in the New Year.
